Refunds:

A 100% refund will be given for any requests for withdrawals received prior to the published Closing Date of any RAT trial. After the Closing Date of a trial, up until five days prior to the first day of the trial, an 80% refund will be given for bitches in season, injured or ill dogs (with verification from a vet upon request) or family emergencies.

Equipment Information:

All equipment meets NADAC standards. The A frame & Dog Walk have rubber surfaces; no slats. Weave poles have 24" spacing.

Volunteer info:

Please volunteer to work! We will be using a whiteboard to sign up for ring crew, leash runner, timer, scribe, and gate steward. Volunteers will receive coupons to use in the workers' raffle.

Awards and Ribbons:

Placement ribbons will be awarded to 4th place in each jump height for each class, except Chances, which is a pass/fail class.

Qualifying ribbons will be awarded for each qualifying run.

Containerized trial:

Food or small toy may be carried into the ring in a bag or container, but may not be visible.

All food and toys must be kept in containers and not left lying loose. See NADAC rules for more information.

JUMP HEIGHTS

There are four Standard Division-Proficient jump heights: 8", 12", 16", and 20".

There are four Standard Division-Skilled jump heights: 4", 8", 12", and 16".

There are four jump heights for the Veterans and Junior Handler divisions: 4", 8", 12", and 16".

Brief Summary of Rules:

Please refer to www.nadac.com for a full explanation of all NADAC rules and up to date information.

- Please note that NADAC trials should provide a safe and fun environment for both exhibitors and their dogs.
- Aggressive dogs will not be tolerated and will be excused from the trial.
- The show committee has the right to refuse any entry. Anyone not currently in good standing with NADAC will not be allowed to enter this trial.
- Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of NADAC rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reasons of riots, civil
 disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause
 beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$25.00 service charge for bank returned checks.
- Dog must be registered and have a valid registration number before entries will be accepted https://www.nadac.com/register-your-dog/ A copy of the current Exhibitors Handbook may be downloaded free from the NADAC web site: www.nadac.com
- Bitches in heat, lame, or blind dogs are ineligible for entry, as is any dog with a deformity which
 may cause a judge to not be able to reasonably assess the dog's ability to function and
 perform agility obstacles safely, and in a manner that is in the best interest, health and welfare
 of the dog.
- No food, clickers, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within 10 feet of the ring. Food or a small non-audible toy can be in a secure container (zip-lock bag is acceptable) in your pocket during your run but you cannot indicate to the dog it is there. All handlers may bring a non-audible toy into the ring for training purposes. They cannot earn a Qualifying score and must declare to the judge they are training before they commence their run. Please read the Exhibitor's Handbook for more information about toys and training in the ring.
- The sponsoring clubs will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any exhibitor whether the result be accident or other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.

AGREEMENT

The person who signs this agreement represents that he/she is authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of both exhibitor and the owner of entered dog. In consideration of acceptance of this entry:

- 1.1. As used here "NADAC" means the North American Dog Agility Council, LLC., its members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees and agents.
- 1.2. Exhibitor/owner agree to abide by the rules and regulations of NADAC and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event.
- 1.3. Exhibitor/owner certify that the entered dog is not a hazard to persons, dogs or property and that the entered dog's rabies vaccination is current in accordance with the requirement of the state in which the dog resides.
- 1.4. Exhibitor/owner acknowledge all hazards presented by the event and the event premises, including, but not limited to, the condition of the surface, restrooms, security measures or lack of, electrical appliances, fittings, show rings, parking areas and the presence of unfamiliar animals and people; exhibitor and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from these.
- 1.5. Exhibitor/owner releases NADAC (including its respective officers, directors, employees, and members), Rainier Agility Team (including its officers, directors, members, and event organizing committee), and Argus Ranch for Dogs (including its officers, agents, and employees) and will defend them and hold them harmless from all present and future loss, injury, damage, claims, demands and liabilities involving the entered dog, the event or event premises. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing hold harmless provisions, exhibitor/owner hereby specifically assumes sole responsibility for and agrees to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expenses (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damages because of bodily injuries, including death, at any time in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, howsoever such injury or death may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused or may have been alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents or any other persons.

RAT'S BITCH IN SEASON (BIS) POLICY

RAT complies with all sanctioning organization rules regarding running a BIS in competition. You cannot crate a BIS inside a building where a competition is taking place. You must keep your BIS at least 100 feet away from a building where a competition is occurring, and at least 100 feet away from any outdoor competition.

(NOTE: NADAC does not allow a BIS to compete at a NADAC trial.)

DIRECTIONS to RUN WILD, AUBURN, WA

From North or South: Take I-5, I-405, or SR 167 to Highway 18 eastbound. Exit onto Auburn Black Diamond Road eastbound. Turn Right onto SE Green Valley Road. Follow for about 7.5 miles. VOLUNTEERS

Please support our efforts by volunteering to work. We will be using whiteboards to sign up for ring crew, scribe, timer, leash runner, gate steward, etc.

CONTAINERIZED TRAIL

Food or a small noiseless toy may be carried into the ring in your pocket provided it is contained in a ziplock bag or small container such as a pill bottle. The container cannot be visible in the ring nor within 10 feet of the ring. You cannot indicate to your dog that you have this item on you, i.e. patting your pocket. You are not allowed to remove the container until you are at least 10 feet outside the ring. All food and toys must be containerized at the trial and none can be left lying about loose. This policy has been implemented to reduce the possibility of dogs fighting over loose food or toys, to diminish dogs dragging their handlers back to their crates (or wherever they left their food), and to lessen the amount of insects that are around loose food.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DOG PARADE AND CELEBRATION:

We will be celebrating our double digit dogs on Saturday, June 22. In addition to the Annual Double Digit Dog Parade, there will be a special photo backdrop and props for saving memories of your double digit dog on this day. Dogs do not need to be entered in the trial to participate in the Double Digit Dog Parade.

Teams must sign up in advance with Doris Dyar and participate in the parade if they want to receive a DDD pin. If a team signs up for the parade but is unable to participate due to injury or illness, they will get a pin. Teams that do not sign up in advance but show up Saturday to walk in the parade may not receive a pin.
