ENTRIES AND CHANGES – Entries submitted prior to the Opening Date will **not** be accepted. NOTE: If you use express mail, check the box “Signature Waived”. Requests for changes or move-ups to your entry must be received in writing or email to the Trial Secretary by November 9, 2026. Day to day move-ups will be accepted.

MEASURING - Dogs with a wither height of 20" or less will need to have proof of measurement or be measured at the trial, unless they are jumping in the highest jump height in that category/division.

TRIAL SITE INFORMATION - The trial will be one ring, 100'x100', indoors on turf. Equipment may include the following: Dog walk, A-frame, Teeter, Open tunnel, Weave Poles (24" spacing), displaceable Tire jump, Non-winged and Winged Jumps, Double Jump. NOTE: All contact equipment will be slat-less and rubberized. A-Frame will be set at 5' 3"

REFUND POLICY - A 100% refund will be given for any requests for withdrawals received prior to the published Closing Date of any RAT trial. After the Closing Date of a trial, up until 48 hours prior to the first day of the trial, a 70% refund will be given for injured or ill dogs (with verification from a vet upon request). For other extraordinary circumstances, please contact the trial secretary, who must get approval from the RAT Board of Directors.

AWARDS – First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded for each jump height in all classes and levels. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded for each qualifying run. Rosettes awarded for New Titles.

If you could finish an ATCH during this trial, inform the Trial Secretary before the trial!!

FEO (FOR EXHIBITION ONLY) - The minimum age for dogs entered in FEO is 15 months of age. Any dog younger than 18 months of age must jump at a lower height than their regular jump height. No points towards titles will be earned in this division.

TOYS IN THE RING - will be allowed at this trial and dogs will run at their regular place in the run order. Toys may be brought into the arena for training purposes. These toys may not involve food or treats of any kind, may not make noise, or may not leave parts behind. It is permitted to toss a toy a SHORT distance. Upon entering the ring, handlers must declare to the judge that they have a toy. They will be immediately eliminated whether or not the toy is used and will have the specified time for training in the ring. If handlers bring a toy in the ring without declaring it, they will be asked to leave immediately.

BITCHES IN SEASON -May run at this trial. To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary, who will mark BIS on the running orders. Any BIS will run at the end of the class, regardless of height. If the dog is not wearing BIS pants, they will start on a mat provided by the show. It is the handler's responsibility to ensure the mat is available for their runs. Pants and/or the rug will be provided by the handler. The handler/owner acknowledges the inherent risk of running a dog on an agility course with BIS pants on and assumes all risk by doing so, and the potential risks with slips from starting from a mat. If used, panties and/or the rug will be provided by the handler. Owners of any Bitch in heat must ‘potty’ their Bitches in heat in an area 150 feet away from the agility area. Bitches in heat must be crated (not in an ex-pen) prior to and during the competition, except when competing, away from the agility ring at a minimum distance of 150 feet. Failure to comply with the above rule will result in dismissal from the agility trial.

Can You Help?

There will be light snacks available but no main meals. Please bring your own lunch.

HIT

We will be giving High in Trial (HIT) awards for Novice, Open, and Elite levels. We will be combining the different programs (Championship Standard and ACE Standard) in to the level the dog is running.

- Follow Green Valley Rd **APPROXIMATELY 7.5 MILES**
- **RIGHT** onto **212th Way SE**
- First **LEFT** into Run Wild driveway Follow signs for parking

FROM SR-169 SOUTHBOUND

- **RIGHT** onto **ROBERTS DR** (in front of coal car)
- Follow Roberts Dr **APPROXIMATELY 4 MILES**
- **LEFT** at **218TH ST**
- Bottom of the hill is **STOP SIGN**
- **STRAIGHT ACROSS OVER CEMENT BRIDGE**
- First **LEFT** into Run Wild driveway Follow signs for parking

VETERINARIAN (on Call 24 hrs) Animal Emergency Clinic, 718 Auburn Way N., Auburn, WA (253) 939-6272 From Run Wild – turn right from the Run Wild driveway, then left on Green Valley Rd for about 7 miles. Turn left on Auburn-Black Diamond road for about ¼ mile to the entrance to Hwy 18 West. Take Hwy 18 about 1.5 miles to the Auburn Way exit. Take a left at Auburn way and drive for about 2 blocks to the clinic.

ASCA® ENTRY INFORMATION

- All ASCA® agility trials are open to purebred and mixed breed dogs.
- Dogs do not have to have an ASCA® registration or Qtracking number to participate in an ASCA® agility trial.
- If your dog is an ASCA® registered Australian Shepherd, fill in your dog's ASCA® registration number where designated on the entry form.
- If your dog is not an ASCA® registered Australian Shepherd and you would like to earn ASCA® titles, you need to obtain an ASCA® Qtracking number for your dog. Any dog is eligible to get an ASCA® tracking number (not just Australian Shepherds). Once you have an ASCA® Qtracking number, use it as your dog's ASCA® Registration Number. The ASCA® Service Membership and QTracking Number Form can be obtained at the ASCA® website - <https://www.asca.org/wp-content/uploads/2016/04/trackapp.pdf> and will also be available at the trial.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of ASCA® rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.

This trial is sanctioned by the Australian Shepherd Club of America (ASCA®) with the Australian Shepherd Club of Washington as the sponsor club in partnership with the Rainier Agility Team (RAT). Exhibitors, through submission of their entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of ASCA® rules and regulations, including the following rules regarding entry.

- All healthy, trained dogs over eighteen (18) months of age are eligible to compete in ASCA® agility trials.
- The handlers should always conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike fashion.
- Lameness or blind dogs are ineligible for entry.
- Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside the ring or outside the ring, must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial.
- I (we) further agree that when my dog(s) are left unattended, they will be secured in a crate or x-pen. Owners/handlers whose dogs are tethered or improperly secured will not be allowed on the show grounds.
- No collars, leads, food, toys, clickers, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within ten feet of the ring entrance at any time. The only exception to this is leading your dog to the start on lead, and then handing the lead to a steward. All dogs should be on leash when not competing.
- Safety shall always be the foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.
- No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler disqualified from the ASCA® agility program; a dog or handler disqualified from all ASCA® programs; or a member not in good standing with ASCA®.
- The sponsoring clubs will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any exhibitor whether the result be accident or other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.
- Participation is a privilege afforded by the Host club and may be extended or withdrawn by the Host club's trial committee on suitable cause only. Refusal of such entries will be reported to ASCA®.
- There will be no refunds in the event that a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason.
- A 100% refund will be given for any requests for withdrawals received prior to the Closing Date. Requests for a refund of entry fees after the closing date, up to the day before the trial, will be honored less any expenses incurred by ASCWA/RAT, and will be issued for the following reasons: for injured or ill dogs (with verification from a vet upon request) or family emergencies.
- Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for bank returned checks.
- The Junior Handler Division is open to any dog that is being handled by a junior handler who is 17 years of age or younger. Dogs entered in the Junior Handlers Division classes may jump 4" lower than their regular jump height.
- The Veteran Dog Division is open to any dog age seven (7) or older. Dogs entered in the Veteran Dog Division classes will jump 4" lower than their regular jump height.
- Current Jump Height Table, Breed Exemption List, description of classes, levels, and divisions are included in the current ASCA® Agility Rules and Regulations Handbook.

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—Please read the following carefully as it, among other things, may prevent you from suing ASCA® and persons/entities affiliated with it. This agreement could even require you to defend them from demands and suits by third parties that include an assertion of wrongdoing by you. (1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s)/exhibitor(s)/handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as “Applicant”). (2) “Releasees” here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its affiliate clubs; and the officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents of ASCA® and of those clubs. (3) This Agreement voluntarily is entered into by Applicant in exchange for the acceptance of the associated entry form and permission to participate in related activities. (4) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations applicable to this event. (5) Applicant certifies that the entered dog will not pose a hazard to people, property, stock animals, or other dogs, and further that the dog is current with rabies shots along with any other vaccinations required by its state of residence. (6) Applicant acknowledges and assumes the risks to Applicant and Applicant’s dog associated with participation in the event, among which could be ones associated with poor condition of the facilities and surrounding areas; security measures or lack of them; electrical appliances; fittings; show rings; the presence of unfamiliar persons; and the presence/involvement of other animals—whether stock, dogs, or otherwise. (7) Applicant further agrees to comply with all recommended and required health and safety precautions, among which may be those related to social distancing; quarantining; wearing of face coverings; and non-participation of persons exhibiting symptoms or for whom there otherwise has been a likelihood of recent exposure to COVID-19 or other contagious diseases. (8) Applicant additionally acknowledges and agrees to assume the risks associated with taking part in the event though others might neglect compliance with health and safety precautions/requirements or pose an undue risk of spreading disease. For example, as is true as to any public event, there is some risk that Applicant and/or those affiliated with Applicant may catch COVID-19 or another contagious disease at the event. (9) To the maximum extent permissible, this release is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice of law rules. (10) To the extent that Applicant—or another party suing on behalf of Applicant, or suing to recover based on injuries/death/damage to Applicant/Applicant’s dog/Applicant’s property—sues ASCA® (or a board member or staff member or agent of ASCA®) as a defendant, the sole appropriate forum (to the maximum extent permitted by law) for the suit shall be the state or federal courts serving Brazos County, Texas (where ASCA® has its headquarters). (11) Applicant hereby releases and waives any claims Applicant otherwise might assert against the Releasees as to any injury or damage claim connected in any way to any alleged act or omission arising out of, or occurring concurrent with, the event and related activities, interactions, communications, and even adjacent premises. (12) This release is made not only as to Applicant but also for anyone who might assert a claim on behalf of Applicant or based on purported injury or damage to Applicant/Applicant’s dog/Applicant’s property, as well as any heir, beneficiary, assignee, executor, trustee, agent, or survivor of Applicant. (13) Applicant further agrees to assume sole responsibility for and indemnify and hold Releasees harmless from related claims, demands, judgments, and settlement payments. (14) These waiver, release, and indemnification provisions extend even to claims or demands asserting that the acts or omissions resulted in bodily injury or death or from intentional wrongdoing, as well as to attorney fees and other costs of defense. (15) The duties of indemnification further extend to any claims or demands asserted against Releasees that are alleged to have arisen out of the acts or omissions of Applicant, Applicant’s dog, or others affiliated with Applicant. Among other things, this means that Applicant would pay the legal defense of Releasees if someone sued them based on a claim Applicant carelessly exposed the claimant to COVID-19. (16) Applicant’s promises in this agreement apply without regard to the type of claim or cause of action asserted against Releasees. (17) To the extent any provision of this agreement is unenforceable, the remainder of it nonetheless is to be enforced. (18) This agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum permissible legal protection from—among other things—claims and suits pursued by Applicant (and/or those acting on behalf of Applicant or over injury/damage to Applicant), as well as from ones based on the purported wrongful acts or omissions of Applicant. (19) Nothing in this Agreement requires you to indemnify Releasees from claims by third parties that involve no allegations of improper acts or omissions by you, those affiliated with you, nor your dog(s). (20) Applicant acknowledges having read, understood, and had the opportunity for independent legal review of this document prior to signing it.
